THEME PARKS

Magic Kingdom is a theme park at the Walt Disney World Resort near Orlando, Florida. The park opened on October 1, 1971, as the first of four theme parks at the resort. The park was initialized by Walt Disney and designed by WED Enterprises. Its layout and attractions are based on Disneyland Park in Anaheim, California, and are dedicated to fairy tales and Disney characters. In 2019, the park hosted 20.859 million visitors.

Cedar Point is a 364-acre amusement park located on a Lake Erie peninsula. Opened in 1870, it is the second-oldest operating amusement park in the United States behind Lake Compounce. Cedar Point is considered the flagship of the amusement park chain. Its newest roller coaster, Steel Vengeance, opened to the public on May 5, 2018. Cedar Point's normal operating season runs from early May until Labor Day.

A Harry Potter-themed attraction at either a Disney or Universal park was rumored in 2003. However, the rights to the Harry Potter franchise had been acquired by Warner Bros., who denied all rumors. In 2004, Rowling signed a letter-of-intent with Disney, with the company intending to develop a Harry Potter section within the Magic Kingdom park at Walt Disney World. On May 31, 2007, Universal, in partnership with Warner Bros., officially announced The Wizarding World of Harry Potter would be added to Islands of Adventure. It includes re-creation of Hogsmeade and three rides. Hogsmeade contains many gift shops and restaurants from the book series including Dervish and Banges, and the Hog's Head.

This marine mammal park, oceanarium and animal theme park were opened by the Governor of Hong Kong Sir Murray MacLehose, It became popular but by 2005 was unprofitable and widely expected to lose out to the new Hong Kong Disneyland. However, the Park responded with a HK\$5.5 billion development plan that saw it expand to over 80 attractions and rides, and steadily grow visitor numbers to 7.6 million in 2014, making it the world's 13th most visited theme park, and one of the largest theme parks in Asia.

In Universal Studios situated in the heart of Resorts World Sentosa 28 thrilling rides and seven themed zones await. Here one can get an adrenaline rush on rides like Battlestar Galactica and TRANSFORMERS The Ride, while the small ones laugh along to Sesame Street Spaghetti Space Chase and meet characters like Po the Panda and the Minions.

China's first and second most popular theme parks according to attendance are in Hong Kong. Ocean Park has about 7 and a half million visitors a year and ranks as the 13th most visited in the world. Young people in the region like going there for the rides and animals. Lantau Island in Hong Kong gets about 7 and a half million visitors a year and ranks as the 15th most visited in the world. Children like the rides, acts, and the cartoon characters. It is the fifth Disneyland built in the world.
